The finals provided a defensive battle that went down to the wire. The game was tied 6-6 at halftime and both offenses struggled to establish a consistent attack. After an intense defensive stop, Phi Delt got the ball back with just over two minutes left in the game and 60 yards of turf ahead. The offense methodically moved down the field as the clock ticked away, and with 19 seconds left, Michigan Alpha was able to score and seal the game on Brandon's Mancini's 15-yard quarterback sneak. All of the brothers rushed to the middle of the field to celebrate this outstanding victory, and they hope to use this as a momentum builder towards the Chapter's goal of returning to Mud Bowl in fall 2006.


