Financially in Black, but Future Repairs to House Require Significant New Funding

2006-07 Annual Fund Drive Under Way

As I am sure you all know, one of the primary objectives of your Alumni Association is to assure the financial stability and long term survival of the organization. So far we are doing O.K. with the Alumni Association existing since June 19, 1895, our date of incorporation. The 15 brothers that signed those original articles of incorporation did so to "promote social intercourse among its members and to provide for them the convenience of a club house." Through the good years and lean years, the Alumni Association has successfully managed, improved, and cared for that "club house," which we all know as 1437 Washtenaw Avenue.

One of the ways we have survived is from the generous contributions from our alumni. In 2004-2005, 71 alums contributed, and last year the number increased to 98 with receipts of \$14,600. Special recognition goes to my pledge classmate, **Stephen S. Clark** '74, as the top individual contributor at \$1,000.

With the competitive nature of Greek housing on campus, there is a practical limit on

the revenue we can expect from rent receipts from actives. That, coupled with the rebuilding efforts of our re-chartered Chapter, has limited our annual income. We have been able to stay in the black (just barely), but still have been able to accomplish some annual repairs and improvements without adding to our debt load of \$400,000. This past year, Father Joseph Fattore '80 was able to rehabilitate the second floor bathroom, repair and tuck point the front porch masonry steps, and make some needed repairs in the boiler room. Our ability to accomplish future repairs, such as the third floor bathroom, north porch rehabilitation, and rear parking lot retaining wall replacement will be tied directly to the support of our alumni. Funding those improvements will not happen from rent receipts alone.



Chapter Leads the Way as Pioneers of Alcohol-Free Housing

UM Director of Greek Life, Mary Beth Seiler, Praises Michigan Alpha

Since the chapter officially came back to campus nearly two years ago, they have gone through great strides to establish themselves as a strong organization. Of course, the chapter faces challenges with an alcohol-free house, but has nevertheless become a unique option for students looking for a house with more to offer than partying.

"The chapter is phenomenal and very distinct from others on campus," said Mary Beth Seiler, Director of Greek Life at the University of Michigan. "They are a group of amazing guys and I am very impressed with their strength and leadership. They are holding their own ground in facing a college cul-

ture that is very different from what they are about."

According to Seiler, other campus fraternities have broken their own alcohol-free rules.

"Unfortunately, 'alcohol free' is not becoming the fraternity way," she added. "It would be ideal if others would follow the Phi Delta Theta example, but unfortunately, others have not."

With a long history and a strong brotherhood, Phi Delt is not letting the alcoholfree status slow them down. In addition to recruiting 11 Phikea for the fall semester, the chapter earned a 3.2 GPA for the Winter

2006 term, scholastically ranking Phi Delt in fourth place among IFC fraternities.

"Phi Delta Theta is taking on a very difficult position, but they are very good, strong students and leaders," said Seiler. "Getting more recruits is all a matter of finding members who are serious about joining an alcohol free fraternity."
