A special thank you to all of you who donated and or attended our Boxcar event and Founders' Day celebration this spring.

A strong alumni relationship and support system is beneficial to a chapter's long-term success. Based on what I've seen at Michigan Alpha, I think our alums are best in the U of M Greek system. That being said, I believe that we need to continue to constantly work on enhancing our relations so that actives can have more opportunities to bond with alums and establish closer personal connections.

I am pleased to say that the fraternity is

continuing to grow and improve. Michigan Alpha is fulfilling its mission to be a leader in the U of M Greek system. In doing so, we are making a positive impact on the campus and the Ann Arbor community.

This past spring, six other Greek houses caused hundreds of thousands of dollars in damage to Northern Michigan ski resorts. As a result, the value of U of M Greek life has been questioned. We are proud that we canceled our ski trip after this happened to avoid any association with these events. Michigan Alpha has continued to be a responsible member of the Greek community.

Thank you for the support of the chapter as we continue to protect our image and strive to be the pinnacle of our community at Michigan and nationally. My hope is that you will find our achievements worthy of your continued support and that we make you proud to say you are a Michigan Alpha alum. We are the following highlights, with much emphasis on this fall semester.

Intramural Sports

After raising over \$3,000 for Autism Awareness, PDT was a part of this year's Winterfest, a broomball tournament hosted by Alpha Sig. We lost in OT to DKE. It was

a great event, and we hope to continue our involvement in years to come.

As for IMs, PDT won volleyball and water polo. We were runners-up in basketball finals and dodgeball. Rec Sports has decided not to give the Stevenson's Cup again this year, but we believe that we would be in the running if they were to do so.

Grade Point Average

Michigan Alpha continues to demonstrate a strong commitment to Phi Delta Theta's cardinal principle of sound learning. During the 2015 winter semester, the active chapter membership collectively earned an outstanding 3.34 GPA, placing the fraternity above the All-Men's GPA (3.28) and, most impressively, the All-University GPA (3.33).

Winter Rush

This past winter, we matched our fall class with a pledge class of 16 excellent men. The active chapter is very happy with their progression as future members who were activated in September. The Pikeia are from six different states: Georgia, California, New York, New Jersey, Illinois and Michigan.

2015 in Review

A Long List of Achievements to Celebrate

As we closed out the academic year in May, the house was in pretty good shape. I mean that as a compliment, for the most part, to our active chapter.

While there was still work to do in some places, the house was more orderly than normal, coming into the summer break. And, in general, the residential rooms were in good shape.

Our projects for this summer included finishing up the replacement of the carpeting in the residential rooms, updating the paint in the bathrooms upstairs, finishing a repair to the dining room outer walls damaged by a leak last winter, completing some minor electrical repairs and confirming the safety systems are in top shape (for their age).

This last item is one we are beginning to put on our agenda for substantial upgrade. Our board consensus is that we are near the time to install a more comprehensive fire safety system including sprinklers. The existing alarm system is due for an upgrade to contemporary technology as

well, and it must be integrated with the rest of the safety system. This is likely a \$150,000 series of projects and will require a huge budgetary commitment. We are pursuing grants and low-interest loans from GHQ to support the system.

The other large project we are studying in depth is a significant update to the South Porch. The initial design ideas include opening it to the side yard to better utilize the great shaded setting and also incorporating handicap access into the house from the top of the rear driveway. We also are looking to update the Bin and convert it to a water tank storage area in support of the fire safety system. We initially expected that the project would be approximately a \$40,000 improvement, but the initial bids have come in higher than that early estimate. The porch is in need of this improvement and continues to be under study.

This is a dog story, and one so old that only guys like **John Buck '54** can appreciate. In the autumn of 1951, we Phi adopted a Great Dane that had worn out his welcome at the PDT house at Bowling Green University. Trevlac was his name, which, we were told without further explanation, is Calvert spelled backwards.

He was a dog so large that when he needed a drink, he was ushered into a bathroom to drink out of the wash bowl!

When I took him home for the summer (my parents lived in the country), he would sit RCA-wise on his haunches between the seats with his head even with mine. This was no problem unless I treated myself to an ice cream cone, at which time he would generate a saliva lake in the front seat, solved by ceding him the whole cone which he would ingest in one gulp!

He and I made the pages of the *Chicago Tribune's* Sunday supplement that winter via a photo showing Trev standing on his rear legs with his front paws on my shoulders, staring eyeball to eyeball with me. He was the third-largest Great Dane on the planet, we were told (not confirmed).

Sadly, old Trev wore out his welcome at 1437 Washtenaw as well. Among his liabilities was a penchant to take to **Cham Kellar's ('54)** bed for rest. A roar equal to the best of MGM's lion would highlight the confrontation. Cham claimed that it was either Trev or him. A vote was taken, and Trev lost ... but it was close! Rumor has it that he was shipped to the PDT house at MSU.

we have ever had, and we are very pleased with this fall's recruitment of 32 total men.

Total Membership & House Occupancy

Currently, our active membership is 90 with our 16 Phiikeia. Our total of 106 members places Michigan Alpha above the U of M fraternity average of 82 members. It is not our goal to be the largest fraternity on campus, as we believe that one of the hallmarks of Michigan Alpha's historic success is the opportunity for men to participate in multiple activities and leadership positions.

We have grown in numbers a lot over the past years, but remain a close-knit brotherhood. Even with our recent growth, we have maintained a size that allows us to know every member — a feat not possible in some houses that strive just to be the largest in numbers rather than best in quality.

In addition to keeping busy with chapter activities, Michigan Alpha members are

involved in campus activities such as Hockey Club, Dance Marathon, management of the Michigan football team, Club Sailing, ROTC, Investment Club, Economics Club, Ski Club, an improv club and many other organizations.

This fall, we have 27 actives living in the house, and our goal is to grow this number in the coming years. This is two more than last year and as our tailgate house is an important asset for us, I believe that this number will continue to steadily rise in the coming years.

Social Events

Despite cancelling our ski trip, we had a great spring semester socially. This fall, we have been excited to be tailgating with the lovely ladies from Zeta Tau Alpha.
